ORDER

Whereas, the Government in Revenue & Disaster management Department has seen it fit to impose restrictions on the free movement of people and vehicles in light of the increasing Covid-19 cases in the neighbouring state of Chhattisgarh.


Whereas, vide Special Relief Commissioner's Order No. 1714/R&D.M(DM) dt. 03.04.2021, Night Curfew has been imposed in the districts of Odisha bordering Chhattisgarh under section 24(1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 read with Rule 8 (1) of the Odisha Disaster Management Rules, 2010.

Whereas, it is felt necessary to give effect to the same through appropriate orders under this code.


Now, therefore, I Ms. Swadha Dev Singh, IAS, District Magistrate, Nuapada by virtue of the powers vested in me under Section 144 of the Criminal procedure Code, 1973, do hereby order as under.

1. A Night Curfew shall be in force in the entire jurisdiction of this District from 05.04.2021 till further orders.
2. The duration of the Night Curfew will be from 10.00 P.M to 05.00 A.M every day, unless otherwise noted.
3. All movement of any nature, except that noted hereunder, shall cease during this period.
4. All Shops, restaurants, offices, commercial establishments, markets and movement of individuals shall remain closed/prohibited during this period, unless otherwise excepted.
5. The following activities/personnel are allowed during the curfew period.
  - i. District and Municipal Administration/Police/Govt. officials on duty.
  - ii. Doctors, Medical/ Paramedical staff (Govt & Private), Ambulances and emergency health staff..
  - iii. Emergency workers of utilities such as Electricity, Fire Services, Telecom, Water Supply, Railways and Airport, Transport services.
  - iv. Staff of IT & ITeS companies on production of their ID cards.
  - v. Any person, in case of **medical** or other **emergency**.
  - vi. Owner/staff of Chemist shops.
  - vii. All industrial units.
  - viii. Movement of public transport, private vehicles and taxis(including cabs by arrangements like Ola, Uber etc) to and from airports, railway station and bus terminals/stands/stops, for facilitating movement of passengers by air, rail and road.
  - ix. Operation of hotels and hospitality units, including their associated offices, movement of staff and associated personnel.
  - x. Dhabas along National & State highways/ major roads **for takeaway only**.
  - xi. Petrol Pumps. & CNG stations
  - xii. Print & electronic Media identified by Dist. Police (with ID cards of respective media houses).
  - xiii. LPG distribution, home delivery of cooking gas and associated facilities, personnel and vehicular movement.
  - xiv. Home delivery of food, groceries, vegetables, egg, fish, meat and other essential items by restaurants and aggregators.


6. The Tahasildars-cum-Executive Magistrates in Rural areas and Executive Officer in Urban areas will be overall responsible for the strict enforcement of these rules.
7. Block Development Officers will brief their Sarpanchs and PEOs to ensure these rules are followed in the Gram Panchayats.
8. All IICs/OICs will be in close touch with Tahasildar/ E.O, NACs and ensure enforcement through regular checking, fines and necessary action under the various statutory provisions.
9. The I.I.Cs. should undertake night patrolling in their respective jurisdictions for strict enforcement of the order.
10. The Superintendent of Police may brief all personnel accordingly and chart out the overall enforcement action plan for the District.
11. Strict vigilance is especially enjoined in the Police Station bordering the State of Chhattisgarh i.e. Jonk PS, Nuapada PS, Beltukri PS, Dharambandha PS, Sinapali PS.
12. No passes would be required for the exempted personnel. An ID card or a travel document would be evidence enough.
13. All enforcement staff are advised to display sensitivity and due regard for people in emergencies.
14. Any person found violating these regulations is liable for action under Section 188 of the IPC as well as section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act,2005 and the epidemic Disaster Act,1897.
15. This order shall remain in force for a period of one month unless rescinded or extended as the case may be.



ORDER

Whereas, the State is passing through critical situation due to detection of new variant of SARS-CoV2 and also rising trend of such new Covid-19 cases in Nuapada district, it is felt absolutely necessary to strictly adhere to COVID-19 safety protocols for containment of spread of the infection.

And whereas, the State Govt. vide Order No. 1663/R&D.M(DM) dt. 31.03.2021 have specifically directed that large gatherings, congregations shall continue to be prohibited in the State and vide Order No. 1714/R&D.M(DM) dt. 3.4.2021 empowers District Collectors to impose further restrictions as felt appropriate.

And whereas, the famous temples of this district has become tourists destination and congregations in the temple and adjoining areas have a potential to cause spread of the virus.


Now, therefore, in pursuance of Order No. 1714/R&D.M(DM) dated. 3.4.2021 of Chief Secretary, Odisha, it is hereby ordered that the visitors/tourists are not allowed inside the Temples such as Yogeswar temple, Patora, Jaleswar Temple, Tikhali and Shiv temple, Patalganga. Moreover, the tourist are not allowed to visit Patora Dam site, Tikhali Dam site and Patalganaga in order to avoid congregation in those tourist spots. In case of any outbreak of Covid-19 infection due to congregation of people in those tourist places, the Tourist Officer, Nuapada. Executive Engineer, UJIP, Nuapada, Executive Engineer, LIIP, Khariar and BDO, Boden shall be held responsible for their respective jurisdiction. Religious rituals in Temples/ places of worship will continue at usual with limited number of persons with strict adherence to Covid-19 protocols. Any person found violating this order shall be punished under the provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and other related laws.

ORDER

In view of increase in Covid-19 positive cases and in consonance with the Order No. 1663/R&D.M(DM) dt. 31.03.2021 Govt. of Odisha in R & DM (Disaster Management) Department, the following guidelines are hereby issued for regulation of social gatherings like marriage related function, death rituals and related functions and other type of social/other type of gatherings in view of public safety.


1. For marriage related functions, the maximum number of persons allowed are 100 with strict adherence to Covid Appropriate behaviour and maintenance of social distancing.
2. For death rituals related functions the maximum number of persons allowed are 50 with strict adherence to Covid Appropriate behaviour and maintenance of social distancing.
3. The following kinds of functions are strictly prohibited until further order.
  - (a) Events and gatherings related to Promotional activities/Conferences/Conclaves etc.
  - (b) Centenary/Golden Jubilee etc celebrations of Institutions
  - (c) Annual events/Annual functions of Educational and other institutions etc.
4. For other kinds of social gatherings the host shall have to obtain specific permission from District Magistrate which will be given keeping in view the requirement of the host and prevailing pandemic situation subject to maximum participants ceiling of 100 persons.
5. The order No: 2630 dated 25.3.2021 issued in this regard by this office stands modified to the extent stated at Sl.No. 1, 2 and 4 above accordingly.
6. This order shall be given effect to from 6.4.2021 until further order.
7. Any permission given earlier regarding number of participants and conduct of functions on and after 6.4.2021 shall stand modified accordingly and no separate modification order will be issued by District Administration or any other authorities.




Now, therefore, in pursuance of Order No. 1714/R&D.M(DM) dated. 3.4.2021 of Chief Secretary, Odisha, it is hereby ordered that there will be thorough screening and checking at the following State border points to dissuade all non-essential travel, to & from Chhattisgarh.

1. Kusumjore & 2. Dhingiamunda under Sinapali Block and
3. Jonk 4. Bhaleswar 5. Dalipakhan(Amanara) 6. Kendubahara & 7. Chulavat under Nuapada block

The above places shall be manned by 4-5 Police personnel and one Executive Magistrate. The Rapid Response Team (Health Deptt) will also visit the places during rush hours for screening and also perform RAT of the symptomatic persons.


The Tahasildar/ Addl. Tahasildar of the area will perform the duties of Executive Magistrates in absence of deployment of dedicated Executive Magistrates by the S.D.M., Nuapada.




